But if you'd rather spend most of your time relaxing on the beach, the property is perfectly functional, comfortable and ready to enjoy just as it is. Clad in painted vertical hardwood boards, the rustic building has three bedrooms, a cosy living room with open fire, a sunny kitchen and a light and bright bathroom. A glassed-in veranda on the northern side and a long room with glazed shutters along the front of the house both capture the sun and warmth. There's off-road parking and pleasant surrounds with trees and shrubs. The cottage is located on 1019 square metre block towards the southern end of Nebraska Beach, on the beach side of the road. A short walking track leads down to the sand. The Dennes Point village precinct, with its community hall, bistro and art gallery, is a short drive or a pleasant level walk away and the ferry terminal at Roberts Point is about 20 minutes by car. Properties just a few steps from Nebraska Beach are in high demand and they don't come on the market often. This one doesn't pretend to be flash, but if you're looking for a simple, welcoming seaside shack at a realistic price, 218 Nebraska Road is well worth a visit.
