This gives developers the option to develop a multi-unit site (with WAPC approval). The country kitchen/meals area is very functional and equipped with electric stand alone stove, twin sinks, dishwasher & air conditioner. The bathroom has been renovated with a solid timber vanity with marble top. There are two large bedrooms and a sleep out, all with reverse cycle air conditioners. This home has a real sense of space both inside & outside. The A Frame decked outdoor area is 63 SQM, complete with lighting, ceiling fan and ramp access, this fantastic entertaining area is perfect for summer and has also has a separate shower & WC. Behind the white picket gate is drive through access (through the double carport) to the huge 6X9 workshop & carport. In the rear yard is a 1963 four tonne Jarrah rail carriage that could be used for a variety of purposes such as a kids cubby house or storage. There is a large backyard for the kids to play in complete with mature fruit trees & vines.
