A superbly appointed kitchen contains 900mm Technika oven and gas cook top, dishwasher, large marble island/breakfast bar and ample storage.Upstairs, an enormous master suite provides a haven from the everyday with lounge retreat, walk-around dressing room and built-in dressing table, while the dual accessed ensuite with its feature marble shower wall, underfloor heating, heated towel rail and relaxing soaker tub, is shared with the 4th bedroom (BIR's).
