Extensive well built gravel tracks provide excellent access across many expanses of the property. There are a number of dams, a gravel source and an abundance of firewood. There are spectacular views from numerous vantage points, including some beautiful potential future house sites (subject to Council approval). The landscape ranges from cleared grassland areas through to bushland, undulating bush gives away to plateaued areas and there are some wooded valleys that would lend themselves to possible future pasture. The current owners have approvals in place for an adjustment to the layout of current titles which, once finalised, will provide 5 smaller titles ranging from 5.5 acres to 8.5 acres (2.3 to 3.5 hectares).....all with amazing views. The new owner could potentially sell these on, and retain more than 750 hectares of rural wonder. Surveying work is largely completed and civil engineering plans have been submitted to Council. As you would expect, there is abundant native of wildlife and plants, plus spectacular views to Brighton, across to Mt Wellington, down the Channel and to the Tasman Peninsula. Simply amazing!
