The Fitzgerald's were astute entrepreneurs and Brewers and the founders of Castlemaine XXXX Brewery. The interiors of this historic 259m2 red brick residence are elegant, spacious and have all the classical architectural elements associated with the early Victorian period - deep cornices, high 4.27m ceilings, elaborate rosettes and decorative ceilings, arched hallway, wide architraves, pine flooring, solid skirting boards and marble fireplaces. Notable features include terracotta corbels on the front entry and the open balcony with terracotta balustrades. These were all features designed to impress and make a lasting statement. The home comprises of an impressive entry door with acid etched sidelights and fanlight, long wide hallway, fully equipped country kitchen with extensive preparation benches and cabinetry, pantry, informal dining room, large sunroom, sitting room with built in bookshelves, grand drawing room, 4 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, laundry with storage and a cellar. The house is serviced with all town facilities, hydronic heating and gas log heater. The established low maintenance garden on 2731m2 includes deciduous and native trees, cottage flowers, extensive lawns, hedging, private and quiet seating areas and wisteria draped pergola which is perfect for alfresco dining. Notable trees include Irish Strawberry, Cedar, Crepe Myrtle, Flowering Apples, Pin Oaks, Maples and Ash. The property includes a 2-car garage and garden shed.Turlough is located minutes' walk from the Castlemaine town centre and in the heart of the Central Victorian Goldfields - a culturally and historically rich and diverse region and the traditional lands of the Dja Dja Wurrung and Taungurang peoples. The area has a vibrant artistic community and a relaxing cosmopolitan feel.
