The open plan dining/living room is warmed by a free-standing Ultimate woodfire and the spacious timber kitchen has a plenty of cupboard storage, a large pantry, Euromaid freestanding cooker + a Westinghouse oven. There are 3 good size bedrooms along with a separate toilet/laundry, a porch/wetroom and a modern bathroom. Stumps and branches have been windrowed and remain post deforestation of the holding in the early 2020's. Native pasture has re-germinated post logging activities, offering fodder for around 70 head of crossbreed sheep and lambs. The remaining 70/80 acres is native Tasmanian bushland. The property offers a sandy loam soil base within a high rainfall area (average 635 mm annually) of Southern Midlands/Coal River Valley. The holding presents an opportunity to cultivate back to pasture or re-establish a eucalyptus plantation. Area: Settled in 1860, Rhyndaston and the surrounding area bore the name 'Flat Top' until it was re-named after a property owned by Welsh pioneer, Charles Meredith. The name Rhyndaston is a Welsh name meaning 'Mouth of the Hole'. The main centre of attraction in Rhyndaston is the railway tunnel which was completed in 1876. A school bus service takes children to Oatlands from Rhyndaston and Australia Post offers drive by delivery. Rhyndaston is only a 20-minute drive south of Oatlands (via Stonor and Rhyndaston Roads) and Hobart CBD is a little over 50 minutes' drive (via Coal Valley) away.787 Rhyndaston Road offers plenty of options as a grazing holding or to re-invest in as a native plantation for the entry farmer or farming family as their first dip into the agriculture industry.
